

Frank Pergande, vice-chairman has written a book about his favourite character in German history: Frederick the Great. Pergande readily answers 50 questions about the King of Prussia; in particular the question of Frederick's greatness. Pergande is investigating whether Frederick was happy only in Rheinsberg, as he himself alleged; whether Frederick suited as a philosopher; why he did Goethe down; and whether it is true that Frederick was Prussian-economical or even mean. Frank Pergande dedicates himself to the little-known treaty that Frederick had negotiated with America. He outlines the long journey of Frederick's coffin until the last will of the great king was finally adhered to. The book was written on the occasion of Frederick the Great's 300th birthday.
